SI President Hanne Jensbo quotes Katherine Hepburn – “If you obey all rules, you miss all fun.” She goes on to say:

“My eyes fell on this quotation the other day, and I asked myself: Is that sometimes what we do as Soroptimists? Do we sometimes stick too much to the rules and procedures, so that we miss all the fun? Do we sometimes forget to use common sense and decode the rules to the very utmost? Some call it bureaucratic!

Maybe it is a delicate question, but let us discuss it with an open mind and without prejudice. Let us be flexible to the prescriptions and rules. Let us work on the ideals of Soroptimism, more than defend the rules to the utmost.

I often say, that Soroptimist International is the most liberal movement I know. A club can decide whatever they want to do, unless of course it is against the vital principals of the constitution. They are free to

free to decide if they will make a project or just drink a nice cup of tea. They are free to decide, if they will recruit new members or just say: We are happy with the number of members we already have!

On this background you may wonder, that the ethos of the work and activities in different clubs all over the world seems to be very similar. How does that come to be? I have never visited a club where the spirit of our common goals was not the first priority! A fantastic feeling to be in Eastern Russia, in Madagascar, in America, or in a club in Europe: the principle and the respect for the Soroptimist goals are high, and the responsibility for the work is high and very similar regardless of our very different cultures and social backgrounds.

For me the real backbone of Soroptimism is FRIENDSHIP AND MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING! That’s what we should care about.”
